
Installs new officers, honors members

LM Chamber Tribute Burt Bundy 1948-2024

Burton Miles Bundy, age 82, passed peacefully at home Jan. 25, 2024 after a lengthy battle with Parkinson's disease, and will take a seat at the poker table with his buddies in heaven who are waiting for him. Burt was born in Santa Maria, CA, but in 1946 his family moved to a ranch in Los Molinos, CA, where he lived to his last day. He was a graduate of Los Molinos High School class of 1959 before attending UC Davis. Burt enlisted in the US Air Force in 1980 and specialized as a jet aircraft mechanic, on F102, F105 and F106's. He was stationed at McChord Air Force Base in Tacoma, WA where he met and married his wife Joyce McGinn in 1982. and then was deployed to Thule, Greenland before being discharged in 1983. In 1988 Burt and Joyce opened the Los Molinos Feed and Supply store. Both were members and served as leaders in the Los Molinos Chamber of Commerce. They owned the business until Burt was elected to the Tehama County Board of Supervisors in 1981. Burt was a leader in water, land and fish issues throughout the north state, serving not only as county supervisor for 5 terms, but also serving as a board member on the California Bureau of Reclamation, the California State Farm Bureau, the Tehama County Farm Bureau, the Regional Council for Rural Counties, the Northern California Land Trust, the Mill Creek Conservancy, the Los Molinos Mutual Water Company, and many more sustaining endeavors to

protect our land and environment. In 1998 he developed the Sacramento River Conservation Forum until his retirement in 2010.

Burt was a husband, father, grandpa, brother, uncle and friend to so many. He coached his sons for years with Little League, was a lifetime member of the Central Tehama Kiwanis and played cards with a group of friends for over 35 years. An avid hunter, Burt's special place was a cabin located on Mill Creek where he enjoyed hunting and fishing with family and friends. He loved the San Francisco Giants, and listened to all of the games on the radio. He loved to fix up old cars and raised cattle his entire life. Burt not only traveled with Joyce, but was a graduate of the 1998 AG Leadership Class 29, traveling around the world and representing his lifelong. passion for farming and ranching. Burt and Joyce commercially raised catfish for 22 years.

Burt is survived by his wife Joyce of 61 years, son Lance (Mary) of Vina, CA; son Justin (Danielle) of Middleton, ID; grandchildren Britta, Missoula, MT; Carson, Brookings, SD; Angus, Abbey (Maxton Langreck), and Axel, of Caldwell, ID; sister Ruthe Reno, Los Molinos, CA and many other family members. A Celebration of Life for Burt was held on Feb, 10, 2024 at the Los Molinos Veteran's Memorial Building.



Rules and Instructions for Parade Participants

Parade lineup and registration begins at 8:30 a.m. at the parking lot of the Los Molinos Veterans Memorial Building (Vets Hall), with the parade starting promptly at 10 a.m. The numbers on the road (which is your entry number presented to you at the registration table) will indicate your position in the parade or alternatively, the position assigned you by parade monitors. Kindly keep your position during the parade and follow the directions of the parade monitors. Secure your entry number to the right side of your person or vehicle. The number must be visible to the judges so that they can judge your entry.

Please note, registration for the automobile category will begin at 7:45 a.m. and judging will begin immediately after. Drivers of all motorized vehicles must have a valid driver's license.

Please keep an adequate space between your entry and the entry in front of you, especially when approaching and passing the judges. With the exception of the Color Guard and the artist performing the National Anthem, there shall be no stopping on the parade route or in front of the judge's grandstand for any reason. Always keep a proper interval between entries to give the judges sufficient time to review and score the entries.

Excessive noise or throwing of items, e.g. candy, literature, etc. from any entry during the parade is STRICTLY
PROHIBITED. Items may be handed to parade viewers. Violation of any parade rules will result in immediate disqualification of entry.

All minors need to be accompanied by an adult through-out the parade route.

This year's theme is "Aloha, Los Molinos." Each entry will be judged for Theme, Originality and Neatness.

Theme is defined as: "The best interpretation of the parade theme." Originality is defined as: "Is the decorations special, novel, spectacular in some way?" Neatness is defined as: "A well thought out theme with a smooth execution." Most importantly, have fun!

The judges will compile all the scores at the conclusion of the parade. This is a time consuming task in order that they can make fair and impartial decisions regarding all the entries. This process should take approximately two hours. Winners in all categories will be announced at approximately 2 p.m. at Mill Creek Park during the annual Playday at the Park event following the parade. Winners will also be announced on the Chambers social media sites, website and released to the media.

Unclaimed prizes, ribbons, and trophies may be claimed at the Los Molinos Chamber of Commerce office by appointment by email at Imcoc2012@gmail.com.

Entries will be accepted by mail, e-mail or may be dropped off at Umpqua Bank in Los Molinos, the deadline is July 1.
